REPORTS & DISCUSSION

Engineer Report –

- 1. **Storm water Compliance** Mr. Hirsh received thrumdrive of all the storm water mapping prepared by Burlington County Soil.
- Sykesville Rd. Phases IV & V Mr. Hirsh submitted a memo to the Township Committee listing all of the patches and areas of concern with the road.
- 3. **Margerum Road** ERI will start the design work next week then send to DOT for review before going out to BID.
- 4. **NJ DOT Grant** ERI will prepare the application for July 1st submission. The project will be Hogback Road at Ward to Groveville Road.
- 5. **Fenton Lane Parking Lot Improvement** Low bid was Richard T Barrett in amount of \$93,974.10. Pre-con meeting will be scheduled once contract is signed.
- 6. **Local Recreation Improvement Grant** We applied for \$77,761.00 to pave walking path at Fenton Lane Park. We were awarded \$63,000.00.
- 7. Olivia Way Park Gazebo, Dugout @ Cricket Pitch Bid was rejected earlier in the meeting and will put it out again.
- 8. **Emergency Generators & Pump Station 1&2** Received submittals for the generators. Troy and Joe are reviewing before ordering equipment and coordinating gas service with PSE&G
- 9. **Public Works Site Evaluation** Joe will meet with Troy next week to go through all requirements needed to function now and in the future. Joe will then provide a recommendation in July.
- 10. County Circle at Old York/Margerum/Chest-Cross Rd. No update.

Mr. Hirsh also supplied the Township Committee with "Project Budget Tracking" and "Grant Summary" spreadsheets.

BILL LIST

Mr. Dhopte made a motion seconded by Ms. Hughes to approve the bill list. Voice vote – All in favor.

Rec Building - Volleyball-

Ms. Koetas-Dale stated that the Chesterfield Volleyball Club is requesting to have the batting cages moved or removed from the recreation building because the wires are in the way. Additionally they are asking for a volleyball system to be installed. After much research and discussion, Mr. Jackson recommended that two out of the three batting cages be removed from the building to make room for volleyball based on the usage. The DPW will remove the cages and use them on the outdoor batting cages when needed. Mr. Jackson and Rachel met with CTAA president Mike Sikorski and he agreed with the removal of the cages. Mr. Jackson will work with the Township Engineer and Troy to insure we are able to core into the floor due to high water table in the park which will be needed in order to install the volleyball system requested. Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Mr. Dhopte to remove two of the batting cages. All were in favor.

SEWA 9/11 Memorial-

Mr. Dhopte asked SEWA Representatives, Sandesh Kamath and Nageswararao Motamarri to present to the Township Committee their 911 Memorial idea. Mr. Kamath stated they have chosen a location at Charlotte Rogers Park based on suggestions from Troy. They are working with Szul Landscaping and have a budget of \$52,000-\$60,000. They plan to raise the money through sponsorships and events. They would like to start work on the memorial the 3rd week of July in order to have it complete by September 11th. They are asking for the Township to partner with them to get the word out to the community and are asking for help from the DPW. Mr. Kamath said they are working with Larry Kuser from Fernbrook, Troy and the DPW to remove and relocate trees in order for the memorial to be seen from the road. They are planning to have solar powered flag poles to help light the area. Mayor Litt asked how the Township can let everyone in town know about the project and how they can help. Mr. Dhopte wants to make sure the project will not need a lot of maintenance from the DPW once completed. Troy said he is working with Szul and SEWA on the project and does not feel it will be an issue to maintain. Mr. Jackson asked Mr. DiYanni and Ms. Hoyer if Green Acres approval is needed. Mr. DiYanni believes it does not since the project is small enough and will not be a substantial impact to the park. Ms. Hover said that she will be sending out the tax bills next week to all residents and can put a mailer about the memorial in with it. Sandesh said he will have a mailer to her by Tuesday and will bring in SEWA volunteers to mail them out along with the tax bills. Mr. Kamath would also like to put out yard signs about the project. Mayor Litt asked that he contact the Zoning Officer Mr. McMahon about the placing of the signs. Mayor Litt thanked Troy for all of his help with the project and said that SEWA was very appreciative. Ms. Hughes made a motion seconded by Ms. Koetas-Dale to approve the 9-11 location and concept. All were in favor.

REPORTS AND ADMINISTRATION -

Mayor - Mayor Litt encouraged all to attend the Chesterfield Elementary graduation next week and the Flag Day Ceremony on Saturday at 10am at the Chesterfield Firehouse. He attended the Annual Cricket Tournament and Charity event a in the beginning of the month and would like to see more people attend next year. Mayor Litt reported there are currently two vacancies on the Planning Board and asked for recommendations and wants to make sure to advertise to the entire community. With the upcoming construction at OYCC, Mayor Litt would like to be able to notify all of the effected residents with any issues and also would like the residents to be able to reach out with any of their questions or concerns. Ms. Koetas-Dale suggested sending out email blasts like the school does. Ms. Hoyer said she is currently looking to have this option once the new website is up and running. Mayor Litt suggested moving to an "incentive based program" for the HPC based on the Township Special Meeting regarding the HPC ordinance a couple weeks ago. Some of the incentives could be tax abatement and low interest loans. Mayor Litt would like to speak with Mr. DiYanni and Wendy Wulstein to find out if this is an option.

ADMINISTRATION-

Mr. Jackson said that he and Ms. Hoyer had a conference call with the State Correction Department. They are planning on building a new women's facility with 400 plus beds on their property. Ms. Hoyer requested DOC look into taking down the four dilapidated homes on Ward Avenue.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Mr. Dhopte to open the meeting to public comment. All were in favor.

Kartik Gopal, 39 Brookdale Way thanked Mayor Litt and the Township Committee for agreeing to remove the batting cages from the recreation building. If there is a water table problem they are interested in discussing something else. He thanked Rachel and Troy for their help and all of the young members for attending the meeting.

Susie Mahon, 16 Chest-Cross Road said there are some issue with the Township website and asked Ms. Hoyer to look into them. She thanked the Township Committee for holding the Special Township meeting for the HPC and asked that the Township look into State grants for the HPC. Ms. Mahon wants to know why her home was selected to be in the HPC district and she would like the reason documented in the minutes. Ms. Koetas-Dale believes the HPC is not currently eligible to get grants because the ordinance is not up to date. Mayor Litt asked Mr. DiYanni to look into this.

Mukesh Patel – 6 Colemantown Drive – He brought his concern again to the Township Committee requesting that no parking be allowed as per RSIS along Marlton Lane.

Michael Sikorski, 77 Waln Road is requesting that the Township look into a walking path down Margerum Road from Waln Road connecting to the walking path at Charlotte Rogers and then across Chesterfield-Crosswicks Road connecting to the walking path on Old York Road leading to Old York Village. He would also like a walking path on Waln Road and one on Chesterfield-Crosswicks Road leading into Crosswicks. Ms. Koetas-Dale replied that a study like this was done years ago with walking and bike paths connecting the town. She will find it and would like the Township to look at the study. Mayor Litt thanked Mr. Sikorski and the CTAA for their cooperation in the removal of the batting cages.

Hearing no further public comment, Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Mr. Dhopte to close public comment. All were in favor.

COMMENTS FROM THE COMMITTEE

Ms. Koetas-Dale asked about Bordentown-Chesterfield Road being closed. Chief Davison replied the road will be closed on June 19th for about two weeks for paving. He will put the information on the Police Facebook page and asks that it is put on the Township website and Facebook page.

Mr. Dhopte would like to complete the analysis on the garbage collection and have it put up on the Township website for residents. Mayor Litt said he does not feel the municipality needs to get involved and it will raise taxes.

Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Mr. Dhopte to approve Resolution 2024-6-16 to go into closed session to discuss potential litigation at 9:07pm.

Ms. Hughes made a motion seconded by Mr. Dhopte to return to regular session at 9:33 PM.

Ms. Hughes made a motion seconded by Mr. Dhopte to adjourn the meeting at 9:33 PM. All were in favor.
